




We all know what it means to "tune in" and to "tune out." Perhaps you picture an old school radio for which being "tuned in" means you're on a clear channel and being "tuned out" means you're lost among the fuzz. Or perhaps you imagine yourself sitting in a classroom where you are either paying close attention ("tuned in"), or you're out in left field, lost in a daydream ("tuned out"). Or maybe for you it's a musical thing, where being "in tune" means being in sync with other instruments and voices, while being "out of tune" is to miss the mark, creating audible dissonance.

In the rhythms of church life, Advent is traditionally a season of waiting, designed to make us more "in-tune" with God's great redemption story. By our Scriptures, songs, and prayers, we await the celebration of God's promised Son, Jesus, who took on flesh for us and for our salvation.

At about the time you read this article (near Thanksgiving), there will be a tsunami of things demanding your attention: sales in the stores, work parties, school concerts, family gatherings, and more. Much of it is well-intended, and yet it sometimes makes us all the more likely to be "out of tune" with the true reason for the season.

Jesus as the one who is for us as our "Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9).

We've collectively volunteered to pack boxes at Community Action House, donated boxes to Holland Rescue Mission, and even spent a long weekend together in South Haven to celebrate reuniting again in person after being vaccinated. It was an amazing retreat for all of us.



Faithful Stewardship


