FELLOWSHIP'S VALUES

How would you describe Fellowship to a friend, colleague, or neighbor? That was the burning question that drove the efforts of a team of Fellowshippians over the past couple of years. The answer to that question emerged from your stories from, experiences of, and hopes for Fellowship. Namely, Fellowship is real, unifying, inviting, and equipping.

These values reflect the very best of who we are as a church, but also who God calls us to be as his church in the world. The beautiful stories, experiences, and hopes that shaped these values not only reflect something unique and compelling within the Fellowship community, but also a deeper longing, a growing ache even, within our larger culture.

In a culture that is often pretending and performing for each other across social media platforms, politically polarized at every level, lonely and alienated from one another, and desperately searching for meaning and purpose, it truly stands out to be a Christian community committed to being real with God and one another, actively unifying around Christ and Christ alone, intentionally being inviting to friends, neighbors, and colleagues, and equipping one another to serve God and God's world. You might say it's providential that these values emerged for us in this place at this time.

Because these values reflect the very best of who we are, we want to **celebrate** the moments when we see them lived out in our community. Telling these stories is a beautiful way to inspire and uplift one another, to encourage one another, and, as the writer of Hebrews says, "to spur one another on to good works." *To celebrate, we want to hear from you as you mark the moments when you witnessed or experienced these four values. During Eastertide, we engaged the 5Gs - Go Toward, Go Godward, Get Curious, Go Deep, and Get Right — to help us navigate, but also transform, conflict in our lives (OiKR 3). Over the summer, we hosted the Grill Out Chill Out as an opportunity to connect with neighbors, friends, and colleagues who don't yet know Christ or have a church home (OiKR 4). We also hosted a Wonder in Worship gathering to become more aware of the ways we experience awe in our daily worship (OiKR 1).

Because these values also reflect who God calls us to be as his church in the world, we want to continually **take steps** toward becoming more real, more unifying, more inviting, and more equipping.

changes for **LOCAL MISSIONS**



We will begin the 2023-2024 school year with some big and exciting changes in our local mission efforts. Some things will look similar like the programs we do: **Kids Hope USA, Hand2Hand, Meet Up & Eat Up,** and the **Hope Christmas Store,** while other things have changed; i.e., who is leading us and the primary space we use to organize!

Kids Hope USA is an established school-based mentoring program built upon a relationship between a Christian church and local school. Volunteers from Fellowship Church meet with students at Lakewood Elementary once a week during the school year; building a supportive and encouraging relationship. As the students graduate elementary and move on to middle school, they have the opportunity to continue within the Kids Hope program by participating in **Kids Hope NEXT.**

Hand2Hand provides food for children facing weekend hunger. Fellowship helps to feed and pray for students at Lakewood Elementary and Pine Creek Elementary each weekend during the school year.

Meet Up & Eat Up is a summer food service program where nutritious meals are provided locally by WO Public Schools' food services to children up to 18 years old living in low income areas in our community. During the meal time, volunteers from Fellowship interact and build relationships with the children and families through crafts, games, books, and special events (photo above and to the right).

The Hope Christmas Store is a one-day shopping event for families experiencing excessive financial burdens. The store provides an opportunity for the families to buy gifts for one another at a very discounted rate. The gifts are all generously donated by the Fellowship congregation. The families that experience the Hope Christmas Store are from Lakewood Elementary, Pine Creek Elementary, and Fellowship Church.



The first big change is our leadership. **Diana Fonseca-Pena** and **Stacie Hoey** are the new Co-Local Missions Coordinators. They have both been involved with Fellowship's local missions for years, but they are stepping into their new roles with hope, gratitude, and excitement. Diana is the Kids Hope Director and leader for Meet Up & Eat Up. She has been a part of Kids Hope for 6 years as a mentor and has volunteered for Meet Up and Eat Up. Stacie will lead the Hope Christmas Store and is the Hand2Hand Coordinator. This will be the thirteenth year for Stacie's participation in both of these ministries.



In addition to the new leadership, the Pantry space got a facelift! *Thank you to a very dedicated team of volunteers from the Fellowship family who helped to make this happen.* The Pantry is freshly painted with new carpet and additional shelving for the food. There is also a two person workstation that has been added, allowing the new leadership team to work together in the renovated pantry. Diana and Stacie have been working hard to organize the food and various supplies into the new storage spaces. Feel free to stop by and check it out!

giving

At Fellowship, our desire is that everyone would belong, grow, and serve. These often happen best in community which is why we are called Fellowship! Recently, the surgeon general released a report called "Our Epidemic of Loneliness and Isolation" with the subheading of "The Healing Effects of Social Connection and Community." In some of the opening paragraphs Dr. Vivek H. Murthy shares:

"Loneliness is far more than just a bad feeling—it harms both individual and societal health. It is associated with a greater risk of cardiovascular disease, dementia, stroke, depression, anxiety, and premature death. The mortality impact of being socially disconnected is similar to that caused by smoking up to 15 cigarettes a day, and even greater than that associated with obesity and physical inactivity. And the harmful consequences of a society that lacks social connection can be felt in our schools, workplaces, and civic organizations, where performance, productivity, and engagement are diminished..."

Might this be a time where Fellowship, and other area churches, are uniquely prepared and ready to help people of all ages in our community experience connection and freedom from loneliness? One of our goals (OiKRs) this year is to extend more than 10,000 invitations to people in our community, where we each take responsibility to connect with others and invite them to be a part of something where they can experience a rich life with Christ and others through belonging, growing, and serving.

Thank you for being a part of the solution through your financial gifts to Fellowship. We are seeing the Spirit move as we welcome many new faces on Sunday mornings, experience new ways of growing as faithful followers of Jesus through the Immerse Bible Experience and so many other opportunities, and lean into being a place of peace in an ever divisive world.

This summer we gathered outdoors on a Sunday evening to *interactively experience* awe and learn about its impact and cultivation in our daily lives and Christian worship. We used the research in Dacher Keltner's book, entitled, *Awe: The New Science of Everyday Wonder and How It Can Transform Your Life* to provide us with a fresh framework and language for what has been true for ages – that God meets us in the transcendent, and changes us to become more like Christ. Keltner defines awe as "the feeling of being in the presence of something vast that transcends our current understanding of the world." Experiencing awe has been shown neurologically to quiet the parts in our brains that drive competitive, individualistic, lonely, and self-centered behavioral instincts. Awe draws us into a sense of greater belonging and a "right-sized" view of self. Awe is experienced in a variety of ways, but most often via the "8 Wonders of Life" (nature, music, collective effervescence, visual design, epiphany, life and death, spiritual knowing and practice, and moral beauty). If you don't know what those categories refer to, I'd *love* to talk more about it with you! We connected these wonders with what God has given us in nature and community, the teaching of the Scriptures, and the person and work of Jesus Christ. We sang, we mindfully engaged our senses in nature, and ultimately, we took home our shared epiphanies (learnings and "aha!"s) and recognized in the person of Jesus the truest fullness of "moral beauty" (courage, forgiveness, sacrifice, radical love for another, etc.) that transforms the world. We will continue to explore a mindful awareness of how we experience awe in ever-increasing ways in our worship services and are eager to grow on this integrated journey together. Join us!

When is the last time you stopped to consider your own shadow?

Shadows are fascinating to think about. Perhaps you heard someone say, "He casts a tall shadow" or, "It's hard to live in her shadow." The Bible speaks often of us resting "in the shadow of the Almighty" (Psalm 91:1). It could even be said that all of world history is best understood as being "in the shadow of the cross." It's fascinating to think about shadows. You have a shadow - we all do! Live small, and you'll cast a small shadow. Live large, and you'll cast a tall shadow. But no matter the size, we all have a shadow. This fall at Fellowship, we want to invite you to think about "Casting Shadows." We'll not only consider the shadows of the Biblical "greats" who have gone before us, but we'll also give attention to our own shadows and the collective shadow of Fellowship Church. For now, here are a few prompts to get you thinking about shadows:

Remember that every person casts a shadow... even you!

When Grandma speaks and a grandchild hears - that's shadow casting. When a business leader chooses integrity over profitability - that's shadow casting. When a teacher keeps on loving kids who are hard to love - that's shadow casting. When your friends are gossiping and slandering but you speak up to say, "How 'bout let's NOT talk about that?" - that's shadow casting. When the Bible speaks of our deeds having a generational impact (Exodus 20:4-6) - that's shadow casting! In due time, perhaps already now, people will live in your shadow. Importantly, in the Bible, there are some famous characters who cast tall shadows - Adam & Eve, Abraham & Sarah, Jacob & Esau, Shiphrah & Puah, Ruth & Boaz, Saul & David. This fall, we intend to study their stories and to live in their shadows. We'll find, in God's big story, an invitation to consider how we are often just like them.

Accept that every person has a "shadow side"... even you!

Truly, none of those Bible characters listed are perfect, and neither are we! The only person in world history who casts a tall shadow and has no hidden flaws is Jesus, the Savior of the world. The rest of us have skeletons in the closet, or what many wise teachers call a "shadow side:" negative characteristics we wish would remain hidden but which must be acknowledged. And the reason God has designed a great rescue plan for all of us is precisely because we all need rescuing. Our shadow side - our fears, anger, and greed, our lust for power, our need to be needed or seen - these things will ruin us if we do not face them and let God redeem us. Sometimes it's just plain good for us to admit who we really are: the good, the bad, and the ugly. So alongside the stories of some of the Bible's most famous characters, we'll also seek clarity about who we are, admitting together, "This is us" - for better and for worse.

A closing question: Have you ever tried to run away from your own shadow?

Spoiler alert: it doesn't work!

A better plan is to join God in making good use of our shadows, leveraging our strengths, even while recognizing that in the spiritual life, God wastes nothing - not our gifts, not our circumstances, and not even our sins. All is fair game for God's use in God's cosmic rescue plan.

So, friends, in the fall of 2023, please join us as we consider together: "Casting Shadows." First, in September and October, we'll explore the stories of "The Famous Pairs" who have gone before us - the biblical legends - and we'll admit together, "We are them" as we live in their shadows. Then, in November, we'll consider our own shadows, exploring together who God is calling us to be as Fellowship Church in 2023, and we'll dare to say, "This is us." Our Gallery will be provocatively shadow-y too. So if you haven't noticed your own shadow lately — please do so, and let it get you thinking deeply about what God is up to in the world today!
